GOD ON THE MOVE



in Aftercare

God is on the move in our Men's Aftercare Program! Along with the increase in the number of students, we are seeing many of those who followed Christ upon intake grow up in Him, and some of those who rejected Christ at intake be reconciled to Him. God is moving the hearts of incarcerated men to begin and continue their Christian walk here at Jubilee.

Men's Aftercare has more than doubled in size in the last three months, with men coming from facilities around the state. We've accepted three men from State Correctional Institutions at Mahanoy, Forest, and Phoenix who total nearly 45 years of incarceration between them. Another four men have come to us locally from the Lebanon County Correctional Facility, and two others from as far away as the Bedford and Franklin County Jails.

Many of these men arrive with a love for God but lack needed life skills and relational support. Through the Christ-centered teaching, counseling, and life skills training provided to each man in Jubilee's Aftercare Program, we see God growing these men in their knowledge

of Him and in their own self-awareness. More than that, we see God helping these men live righteously, according to what they are learning!

Others arrive with nothing — no love for God and no real resources. However, God is at work in these hearts as well. Two of three men who entered our program as unbelievers have recently trusted in Christ and are bearing the fruit of repentance in their attitudes and actions! God is helping these men to really live for the first time.

This growth comes with challenges. As our staff lead students through their medical, legal, and relational issues, the spiritual issues God brought them here to work on are exposed. Biblical concepts of conflict resolution, work ethic, and servant leadership are constant discussion topics and prayer points. To that end, our students have initiated their own evening prayer group to encourage one another in this new life! God is on the move in our Men's Aftercare Program, so please pray that our students go with Him!

God on the Move in the Prisons

Jubilee is excited to be providing chaplaincy services in 9 prisons throughout Pennsylvania. Our 14 chaplains lead worship services, teach Bible studies, provide individual counseling, oversee pre-release classes, teach discipleship classes, visit cell blocks, and minister to prison staff. This ministry is taking place in these county facilities – Bedford, Lackawanna, Lebanon, Luzerne, Northumberland, and Snyder. Additionally, three male chaplains serve the population at the following State Correctional Institutions – Camp Hill, Frackville, and Mahanoy. Listen to what some of our chaplains are saying:
