DESTINATION: Belize

Bill Houser, a truck driver for Jubilee, had an encounter five years ago with Shawn, one of the students in the Aftercare Program. As the two stood just inside the dock of the Lebanon store waiting to ride the industrial elevator to the third floor, Shawn struck up a conversation with Bill and learned that he was once a missionary. Excited to hear this, Shawn said, "One day, I am going to go on a mission trip!"

Now, years later, Bill and his wife Judy would lead a team of nine people to Belize, three of whom were graduates of the Jubilee Aftercare Program. Shawn was one of them. The others were Felix Diaz and myself.

As members of one of the seven churches that make up the Lebanon District Mennonite Churches, Bill and Judy were asked to maintain the relationships they developed as former missionaries to Belize more than 50 years ago. Since this partnership began, they have helped to lead two teams to Belize.

Since Jesus delivered Felix, Shawn, and me from addictions, we have given ourselves to the call to go into all the world with the Gospel. And, because of our shared story as graduates of Jubilee, we have a bond like no other. When I entered Jubilee in 2004 Felix was my supervisor. In 2016, as a volunteer for Jubilee Ministries, I met Shawn while teaching a Bible study in prison. Later that year, Shawn joined the Aftercare Program and I became his pastor, mentor, and friend.

On March 30, 2022, nine people left Pennsylvania for Central America. I could tell nine stories of nine lives that were impacted by the wonderful people in the beautiful country of Belize, but my focus will be on these three former students of Jubilee.

Years ago, who would have thought that this group of men who were "just students" would be carrying the Good News of Jesus Christ to other parts of the world? I know I didn't until 2018, when I was approached by a fellow employee of Eastern Mennonite Missions who asked, "So, what other countries have you been to?" I thought nothing of the question when I answered, "I have never set foot off of U.S. soil." The person's reply scared me, "Well, in September I'll take you to Central America." I was intimidated with the idea of traveling that far outside of what was familiar. But in 2018 I headed to Belize for the first time. The experience was so powerful that I was determined to incorporate missions into my discipleship of the men I am privileged to serve as a pastor and urban missionary in the City of Lebanon. Shawn was the first person to make this dream a reality.

Everywhere Shawn goes, he brightens up the room with his smile. It was easy to see why the children of San Narciso flocked to him, especially a 13-year-old named Haizen, and a 12-year-old named Jonathan.

Neither boy is growing up with a father. Because of the poverty, most men have to find work far outside of their villages. The boys' fathers work three weeks out of the month, far away from home, just to make ends meet. Shawn's life was forever impacted as he engaged with Haizen and Jonathan.

Felix, who typically says no to just about every invitation, said yes to this trip! Felix doesn't know exactly why he said yes, but after 10 days in Belize he has said that he can't wait to go back! I believe this was God stretching him because someone in Belize needed to hear his story. After Felix graduated from the Jubilee Aftercare Program, he went to school, earned a degree, and is now a certified addiction counselor. With many years of experience, he was able to connect with a man he met in San Narciso who was struggling with alcoholism.

During the week we worked on building block walls for a house at the back of a church. I didn't keep track of the hours, but the entire team gave everything they had to accomplish the task and complete the walls before we left. Under normal weather conditions, this would have been simple, however, with a heat index of over 100, each day was challenging.

Bedo, the only paid foreman, said, "I have worked with missionaries before, and usually they are excited and give everything they have on the first day, but the rest of the week, they don't work. But you guys, even in this heat, gave everything you have, every day, all day!"

This team was a complete team. Each person brought a heart of servanthood, and each received the blessing of the village of San Narciso. 🤊

When he got up to leave, he asked me what I was going to do with the money. I told him I have been sending a child to camp in the summer through Jubilee Ministries. He gave me another \$400 and said, "Let's send two children to camp!" So, the \$800 is from me and the man from All County Jewelry, Coins & Antiques. There are still good people in this world! Praise God!


